

## A Call for Community Cooperation

The Eagle Police Department is looking forward to cooperation from all of the residents in the Eagle Ranch Village Homes area to comply with the new rules and ordinance regarding the parking of vehicles on the street during a snow event. Please read the ordinance (12.12 – Parking on Emergency Snow Routes). The law is specific and self explanatory. Should you have any questions, you may call our office during business hours at 970-328-6351 or our Communications Center at 970-470-2200 and ask for an Eagle Officer to call you back.

Our intention is for all residents to be conscientious about complying with the Odd-Even parking restrictions during snow events. The Town of Eagle is prepared to ticket vehicles/owners, or tow/impound vehicles at the owner's expense that are deemed to be interfering with snow removal operations.

Your safety is our primary concern. It is essential that the fire equipment, emergency medical vehicles, snow plows, and police are able to safely negotiate the narrow streets in your neighborhood.

## Snow Route Ordinance

Section I. That Section 11.04.020 of the Eagle Municipal Code, concerning additions or modification to the Model Traffic Code for Colorado, is hereby amended to include the following additional subsection:

E. Part 12, concerning Parking, is hereby modified by the addition of a new Section 12.12 to read as follows:

**“12.12. Parking on Emergency Snow Routes.** “During a snow event, it shall be unlawful for a person to stand or park a vehicle on the side of the street that constitutes an emergency snow route with even numbered addresses on even calendar days; and on the side of a street that constitutes an emergency snow route with odd numbered addresses on odd numbered calendar days from 5:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. For the purposes of this Section, a “snow event” shall begin when there is two inches (2”) of un-drifted snow accumulation and shall remain in effect for seventy-two (72) hours after the snowfall ends. Vehicles parked in violation of this Section shall be subject to being towed pursuant to Section 11.12.010 of the Eagle Municipal Code.

# Eagle Ranch Snow Event Parking Information

## Working Together

Over the past few years during the biggest snowstorms, parked cars made it impossible to adequately remove snow from the streets in Eagle Ranch. At times emergency vehicles could not drive down some streets. The Town of Eagle Public Works and Police Department have worked with the Eagle Ranch Association, Village Homes Homeowners Association, Select Management, and Mountain Caretakers to develop a solution to this problem.

## Parking Signs

The Town is introducing special parking restrictions during snow events and will be installing signs throughout the Eagle Ranch Neighborhood District. Please take note of these signs and understand what these parking restrictions mean.



## Restrictions

Snow Event: When two (2) inches or more of un-drifted snow accumulates and is in effect for seventy-two (72) hours after the snowfall ends.

Parking Restriction Schedule: On days a snow event occurs, please follow this even/odd schedule:

- There is no parking on the odd numbered side of the street on odd calendar days and there is no parking on the even side of the street on even calendar days.
- Restrictions are in place from 5:00am to 5:00pm.
- All of the streets in the Eagle Ranch Neighborhood District are designated Emergency Snow Routes except Capitol Street.
- All Emergency Snow Routes follow the odd-even schedule except Eagle Ranch Road south of Sylvan Lake Road (by the Brush Creek Elementary School). For this section, no parking is allowed on either side of the street during snow events.

## Cooperation

Snow is a fact of life in Eagle and we need everyone's cooperation to help us adequately remove snow from streets. It only takes one parked car on the wrong side of the street to prevent our crews from cleaning the streets properly. If you see our equipment working, please move your car(s) immediately.

We will be moving snow in the neighborhoods as early as 5:00am. If you do not want to move your car prior to 5:00am, then you should park on the correct side of the street anytime there is a chance of snow accumulation. If you have a driveway, please park in your driveway.

**Remember,** parking restrictions are in effect for seventy-two (72) hours after the snowfall stops. This will allow our crews to clear both sides of the streets.

\* **A note from the Eagle Ranch Homeowner's Association:** Please do not park in the alleys during a snow event, as the alleys need to be clear for plows as well.

Please be aware the Town plans to enforce all parking laws during snow events. Cars parked illegally will be ticketed and may be towed at the owner's expense.
